



North Edgebrook Civic Association FAQs

Q: What is the North Edgebrook Civic Association (NECA)?

A: The North Edgebrook Civic Association, also known as NECA, was established in 1941 as a neighborhood advocacy group with the primary goal of supplemental snow removal keeping side streets cleared during the winter months. This service is very important to our community given that many residents do not have garages or driveways, so over the years NECA has established relationships with private contractors to plow the streets curb-to-curb after 2 inches of snow fall.

The Association is the voice of the community and has 12 board members who are dedicated volunteers actively working with governmental and local agencies, including the Chicago Park District, the Chicago Police Department, our alderman's office and the local zoning board.

Q: Where is North Edgebrook located?

A: North Edgebrook is a neighborhood on the northwest side of the city of Chicago. The neighborhood includes approximately 800 households within the perimeter of Caldwell on the west, Lehigh on the east, Mendota on the south and Touhy and Sherwin on the north.

Q: Who can join NECA?

A: The association is open to residents of the North Edgebrook neighborhood.

Q: How much is it to join?

A: Membership dues are primarily used to cover the hefty expenses associated with hiring a private contractor to support snow-removal services on our side streets during the winter after 2 inches of snowfall. This service has helped many residents over the years, but we need the support of the entire community to maintain this service.

Membership dues also help maintain our small garden area located on the corner of Caldwell and Estes and our distinctive “Welcome to North Edgebrook” signs that are located throughout the neighborhood. From time-to-time the Association may consider other community-interest activities, but this all depends on the amount of funds we have available.
